COURSE NEWS

Green speed is 10 feet.

Last weekend unfortunately we lost irrigation on the course due to our pump cutting out Saturday night, which meant the course had no water for the whole weekend. Some of our greens did suffer, but not to worry, we are on the case, and they are already showing good healthy signs. This week the greens received fertilizer, wetting agent and an application of preventative fungicide.

The good news is the rough got a full wire to wire cut and the course is looking amazing, (so I've been told). In front of the 13th green, unfortunately we were not able to get to this area due to the contractors needing us to install the new irrigation in the 4th and 8th tee blocks, it is at the top of the list to do next week!

New tees - the 15 and 17th have been fertilized and will get an application of wetting agent tomorrow (Friday). We will be looking at giving them there first mow towards the end of next week maybe the following Monday, all depends on the weather. Update on 4/8 tees, the shapers have been in, and I believe they will be hydroseeded early next week.

Next week in front of 13, we have a few irrigation jobs, and we will be doing some bunker work.

NEW TEE BLOCKS

I received word this week there has been some confusion over the playability of the newly turfed Tee Blocks, and apparently someone has actually played a ball and taken a divot in this area.

I am sorry this is my fault (Vance), I had just assumed the taped off area was enough of a sign to deter entry. Anyway, Rohan is going to tape the area with **KEEP OUT** tape and mark it as **GUR** so there should be less confusion going forward.

These area's are **NO PLAY ZONES** and as such you do not have the option to play the ball as it lies. If your ball lands in these area's, just leave it there. If you have hit a shot so poorly that it has finished there, you really don't want that ball back – please don't walk in these newly turfed areas.

Drop area, same as with any GUR, "nearest point of relief no closer to the hole"
