Green speed is 10.1 feet.

Unfortunately we were unable to spray Monday or Tuesday, but we got out there Wednesday and hit the disease with some fungicide. The greens should start to recover over the next week or so. We have had a little problem with the rough mower but it's back up and running and we will be out to cut 4 laps of every fairway this week.

New tees

With having all this wet weather, I have decided to hold back the opening for one-week, new open date is the 14th of February. They are now getting cut at 12mm which our normal cutting height. They have been sprayed this week with Primo max and some iron. We have also continued with tidying of paths and surrounding areas of the new tees.

With it being a short week, we have a big decision if we go a full wire to wire cut of the course. We would like to, but we'll see how things go....

Russell and Barry did some repairs to the driveway entrance and have installed some new poles to guide people onto the driveway correctly.

Paul and Walter did a great job of weed trimming around the native area by the 12th Tee Block. They then assisted in picking up debris off the course from our recent winds.

Harv and I trimmed the large bush that was overhanging the 11th Tee Block and inhibiting the grass cutting around that area. (Puds will be happy now)

We also trimmed some overhanging branches between the 2nd green and the 3rd tee walkway. We used the recently acquired Pole Chainsaw; this saw was purchased with the funds mainly provided by the Thursday Men's Golf Group. The saw is great to use and does a fabulous job, so thanks again to the Thursday men.

We then also picked up debris around the course.

Mike Smith was busy weed spraying all bunkers (I don't know why, he never goes in any).

As we still have quite a few of the team away, we have decided that there will be no organised working bee next Tuesday. However, if you get sick of sitting around there is always some gardening to be done. Around the cart shed could do with a tidy up.

Someone could also pick up all the stray golf balls down the left-hand side of the practice fairway.

Another job is to weed trim around the sponsors' signs and also clean them.

We have some great projects coming up that will be managed by Russell:

- Removing and rebuilding the fence around the carpark.
- Repair the clubhouse roof.
- Build Aggregate bins with the Keystone Blocks donated by Grow Landscaping.
- Russell also organised someone to locate the cables around the carpark fence and the soak pit by the carpark entrance today. Now that we know where the location of these cables, we can organise getting the soak pit dug up and cleaned out so that it drains and this should stop the water pooling around the carpark entrance. Which in turn will eliminate the constant potholes forming.

SHOOTOUT 2026

This year-long competition has been rightly claimed as one of the BEST competitions we run at Coringa.

The competition begins this Saturday, January 31st, and runs for the duration of the year with the final scheduled for early November.

It is open to ALL members, men and women, who play in the Saturday match of the day.

It is a Stableford competition and throughout the year the 10 BEST Stableford scores of each player are used to determine the top players to qualify for the final in November.

Once you enter all you need to do is watch the weekly update on the Coringa website to follow your Progress.

Entry fee for the competition is a one-off payment of \$20 and all entry fee money is allocated to the prize winners. You may enter at any time during the year, but obviously the sooner you start recording scores, the better.

The Final: - SHOOTOUT

In November, the top 10 players will compete in the final round shootout,

The shootout is played over 9-holes, it starts with 10 players, and at the completion of each hole, the person with the worst score is eliminated,

1 person is eliminated on every hole, until a winner is declared on the final hole.

The more entries we have the better the competition (and the higher the prize money!), so please get involved and if there are questions about the competition, feel free to ask me or anyone who has been involved in the competition in the past, it is always a lot of fun.

The current holder of the SHOOTOUT TROPHY is Mal Ashton

SUMMER RINGERS

After the completion of Round 7, Liam Longley (19.340) who did not play this round, retains the top spot on 52.660. He's ahead of Jonathen Kemp (18.280) who also took the week off remains in second spot on 53.720, a margin of 1.060 separating them. Alan Wicks (15.271) holds third position on 53.729, 0.471 ahead of Colin Harrison (17.800) in fourth. With Vance Hetaraka (12.729) improving 5 spots into fifth position on 54.271.

Currently all 50 competitors are under net par after the seventh round, the leaderboard will change dramatically over the coming weeks and the narrowing of the range of net scores as the field compresses.

There were only 10 birdies or better recorded last week, bringing the overall total to 162, with the highlights this week being, the +1 round of 74 carded by Spencer Wicks (4.167) off the White tees, with two birdies and three bogeys. Roy Wang (7.414) shot an improved round this week with a +4 under round of 77 which included 3 birdies on the back 9 and 7 bogeys. There were no additional new eagles carded by the field this week, the total stands at 9.

Dean Harvey (+0.280) continues to lead the birdies or better statistics with a tally of 2 eagles and 10 birdies, followed by Spencer Wicks (4.100) with 2 eagles and 8 birdies then Seok Yong Park (2.050) with an eagle and 9 birdies. Roy Wang (7.680) is next with 10 birdies, then followed by Leighton Sparks (8.900), Kyle Charlwood (10.480), Vance Hetaraka (12.729). David Harvey (9.700), Mal Ashton (8.960) and Justin Velluppillai (7.060) with 7 birdies each.

There are now 39 players so far, to have to registered bogey or better on every hole.

The hardest ranked holes determined by the numbers of birdies or better carded after Round 7, the hardest hole is Hole # 9 with two birdies recorded by the Ringers field. With Holes # 2, # 5 and # 10 next, conceding three birdies each to the field. The easiest hole has been Hole # 4 with 19 birdies or better by different players. The next easiest is Hole # 12 with 18 birdies or better by different players, then followed by Hole # 1 with 15 birdies or better then Hole # 17 with 14 birdies.
