SOUTH ISLAND UNDER 19 & 16 BOYS and GIRLS TOURNAMENT

Coringa has been approached by NZ Golf to host the South Island under 19 and 16 Boys and Girls Championship over the week Monday the 14th through to Thursday the 17th April. The tournament is a 54 hole tournament with a maximum of 144 players. The 14th is registration and practice day while the next three days are the championship days with morning and afternoon fields.

The 2024 tournament held at the Otago Golf Course and attracted 87 participants.

The board has agreed to the approach with Brian Docherty and David Harvey undertaking the planning and management of the tournament co-ordinators role on behalf of the board.

NZ Golf deals with the day to day running of the competition but they have suggested the club will need to provide daily up to seven volunteers, which does not include the potential need for assistance within the cafe and course preparation.

The tournament is open to male and females golfer who have an 18 hole handicap and last year there was ten prizes within the yet to be set divisions.

Once again the Open sub committee has made the decision to charge club member \$35 and non club members \$50 to enter the tournament. It members time to bring some non club member friends to share the experience, of just how good the course can be set up for tournaments.

I would suggest that people organise their groups early to avoid disappointment, as the field is limited to 120 participants again and fills up very fast. In previous years the field has been filled within three weeks of bookings being opened. Once again when you book for yourself or your group, you need to pay either online by making a deposit through the clubs bank account 03 0854 0006713 00 including your name and Dotgolf numbers or through the Proshop, where the sheet will be available from this Thursday the 13th.

Tee times will start around 9.30 and between 10.30 with the draw being entered into Dotgolf in the week before.

Once again there will be a random draw of a putter and a prize for the first 'hole in one' achieved within the tournament.

The tournament is a significant fundraiser for the club. This year the board has decided that the funds raised will be used to assist with the purchase of a new fairway mower, which is consistent with the boards desire to modernise the courses equipment.

There will be again a number of raffles organised for the day. Previously many members have assisted with the purchase of these or provided prizes directly to me. SUMMER RINGERS

After completion of Round 10 of the 2024/25 Summer Ringers Competition, there were about 10 competitors who did not play this round and there was roughly an even split playing off the Blue and Silver tees, with the ladies playing off the yellow tees.

This round saw Leighton Sparks (12.822) continue to hold his lead with another qualifying birdies scored on Hole # 15. He now leads the field with a slightly decreased margin of 2.585 on 47.178, over Peter Marsh (30.238) who moved up 2 places on 49.763 after a weekly improvement of 2.108. Improving 10 places into third place is Peter Bailey (23.060) on 49.940, a further 0.177 behind. Vance Hetaraka (13.350) improved 7 places to lie in fourth spot, on 50.650, a weekly improvement of 1.906. The top 10 places this week are separated by an increased margin of 5.059 (4.312).

There were 15 new birdies or better recorded last week, with the highlights being the sub 80 rounds shot by S Y Park (3.5) and Roan Buitendag (5.3) with 78's off the Blue tees and a round of 80 shot by Lex Halford (11.3) after having an early consecutive double -bogey on Holes # 3 and # 4. There were no eagles recorded this week.

The leader in the birdies or better statistics continues to be held by Leighton Sparks (12.822) with 13 birdies. Next is Mal Ashton (8.763) with a tally of an eagle and 10 birdies, followed by S Y Park (4.543) with an eagle and 9 birdies. Next are Rouan Buitendag (6.025) and Ram Thapa (11.078) having 10 birdies each.

There are now 53 players so far, to have to registered bogey or better on every hole.

The hardest ranked holes determined by the numbers of birdies or better carded after Round 10, is Hole # 9 with four birdies recorded by the Ringers field, with the next being Hole # 2 with only 6 birdies recorded so far. The easiest hole is Hole # 1 with 31 birdies or better by different players. The next easiest is Hole # 12 with 26 birdies or better by different players, then Holes # 14 and # 16 with 18 birdies each.

MEMBERS CORNER

Rules reminders

• This local rule was introduced in August 2024, but it seems many members have forgotten it.

All Unmowed / Uncontrolled Grass Area's shall be deemed a Red Penalty Area

If a players ball is in uncut / uncontrolled grass anywhere on the course, including when it is known or virtually certain to be in

Uncut / uncontrolled grass even though not found, the player may take relief using one of the options under rule 17.1d. Each for one penalty stroke.

Lost Ball or Out of bounds – stroke and distance relief.

Most of us know this rule, if we hit a ball out of bounds, we know we can go up to where the ball crossed the boundary, and play from the edge of the fairway, with a penalty of 2 shots. Where some mis-understanding is happening, is when I play a provisional ball, and I lose this ball as well, or it is in an unplayable lie, can I go back and take my 2 penalty shots from where my first ball went out of bounds.

The answer is NO!, once you elect to play a provisional ball, that is now the ball in play, so before you next reach for a provisional ball, choose your options wisely.
