## Qualifying

Qualifying has completed, and the top 8 in each grade will now advance to the match-play rounds. All qualifying results are displayed on the club website, <u>Club Champs Qualifying results</u>

Any ties were broken by countback of the lowest scoring round, in the case multiple players had the same low scoring round, this tie was broken by the regular countback process, (eg lowest last 9 holes, last 3 holes, last hole)

## Match-play

The first round of match-play is this Saturday - Club Champs Draw

All tee times have been booked, and all players should have been notified by dot.golf of their tee times.

All grades (except Masters) are off the stick – no shots given,

Masters grade is match-play on handicap – the lowest handicap goes back to zero,

# Competitors

- cannot enter the match of the day and will not be eligible for any of the usual jackpots,
- scores will not be counted towards shootout
- It is strictly match play cards do not have to be used or submitted for handicapping, but you can do so if you wish.
- You are eligible for hole in one, or nearest to pin.

#### You Must Maintain PACE OF PLAY!

We know this match is important to you, and we know ready golf is difficult to play during these competitions, but you must continue to keep pace with the rest of the field.

# Process for sudden death play-off

If after 18 holes the scores are tied, players then enter a sudden death playoff, Starting from hole 1 and continuing in hole sequence (1, 2, 3, 4, etc) until one player wins a hole. Master's players, in a playoff, shots are received the same as they were during regulation play.

## Finals Day – is scheduled for Saturday 4th October

36 holes for all grades except Masters,

Historically this day has seen the Champs tee off early, followed by the rest of the club teeing off with a multi-tee start at 10am. This process has worked well, (most of the time,) but often relies on a bit of luck, coupled with a lower than normal turn-out, usually around 80 people (note - max capacity for this day is 92 including Alpha and closes the course until after 2.30pm) (as opposed to a normal shotgun start where all tees are available can manage 128 people)

This year, to accommodate our growing numbers, and to avoid potential overcrowding problems, we have decided to manage finals day differently. By using the normal Start sheet on dot.golf. NOTE- there will be limited tee times available on this day, 110 spots for members (not including Alpha.)

Alpha group will be able to keep their regular tee booking, but will be 30mins later than normal. 12.30pm.

# The process this year,

- the tee booking sheet will open as normal on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> September.
- 7.00am to 7.28am tee bookings will be open to members groups of 2's.
- 7.42am Junior B
- 7.49am Junior A
- 7. 56am Intermediate
- 8.03am Senior
- 8.10am to 10.58am Tee bookings open to members groups of 4
- 11.33am Masters

- 12.01pm Junior B
- 12.08pm Junior A
- 12.15pm Intermediate
- 12.22pm Senior
- 12. 30pm Alpha Group
- 13.30pm Course open to all.

The process allows for club champs to comfortably play first round in 3.5hrs and take a lunch break of 45mins, There is a buffer built in behind the main club field, but even with this built in buffer, the finalists will still catch up to the field in their 2nd round,

Club champs **will not** be able to overtake the field, so they will need to manage their pace during the 2nd round.
