CLUB NEWS

COURSE NEWS

Green speed is 10 feet.

This week has been a busy one as we get ready for coring next week. The greens have been fertilized with their renovation fertilizer, really for coring. The tees have also been fertilized and also got an application of wetting agent.

The course has had a full wire to wire cut, and we are not sure how much grass cutting we will do next week as coring takes our full attention.

We have sprayed holes 4/8/15 and 17 tees with roundup to kill any unwanted grass/weeds before the complete rebuild of those tees that starts on the 28th of October (more on this below). They are still playable they just a pale blue tinge which is just a dye we use so that we know exactly where we have sprayed (and don't spray anywhere but the target area).

Next week – Coring!!!

We will be going in with a 1/2" hollow tine at 80-100mm deep at about 1.4km per hour. Cores will be removed and then 65m3 of sand will go on your greens. Fingers crossed for good weather!!!

A reminder the course will be closed next week until Friday for greens maintenance (Coring)

This is a good time to use your reciprocal cards at Weedons, Bottle Lake, Waimairi Beach and Templeton, Please contact the club's Pro-Shop in advance to play and check on course availability. Note, I have been advised that Templeton has no space available on the 23rd and 24th.

BOARD UPDATE

The Board met on Monday afternoon and there were a couple of important items to update the Club.

AGM date – now 15 November

We have shifted the AGM date to Saturday, 15 November. Unfortunately, this is the Saturday of Show weekend, which isn't ideal, but was the only weekend in November which we could get all the Board in Christchurch. Vance has been kind enough to accommodate the new AGM dates and subsequent shifts to the playing program.

We will circulate the AGM notice and various reports etc in the next couple of weeks (spoiler alert – the Financial Results for the 2024/25 are probably the best the club has ever seen!!)

Constitution

Our Club (like many others) was formed as an Incorporated Society. The Act governing Incorporated Societies has been updated, and all Incorporated Societies need to update their Constitutions to reflect the changes required by this new Act.

The changes required by the new Act don't materially alter the way our Club operates. We have redrafted our Constitution using the suggested template from Golf NZ as a guide. We will shortly circulate the draft for comments. Once we have feedback, we will make any necessary changes and then present this version at the AGM to hopefully be agreed at the meeting.

Tees redevelopment program (this is a big one!!)

For some time now the Board have been considering a program to redevelop all of the Tee blocks at the course. After reviewing the various tenders received and clarifying some final points, we have chosen a contractor (MCL) and the Board have decided to commit to Year 1 of this plan.

Before getting into the details of what will happen this year, the Board thought it was important to explain some of the background to the decision.

Background

We believe the Course is looking better each year, with the Greens continuing to be a strength of the Course. Our Fairways are improving each year with program of fertiliser, coring, reseeding, spraying out of weeds, root pruning, removing trees etc. The Bunkers have improved with regular dumps of new bunker sand.

However, our Tee blocks are not at the same standard as the rest of the course.

Part of the reason is around the original course design.

Coringa was designed as a long course - the current Blue Tees were originally the standard White Tees.

The decision was made some 10+ years ago that the course was too long and a new 'White' course was created by shortening seven holes, moving the tees forward onto the yellow tee blocks. This shortened the course but meant moving a lot of volume onto the yellow tee blocks that are generally smaller and not designed for this amount of traffic.

Ideally the Club would have redesigned these Tee blocks when it changed the course, but didn't have the money.

About five years we still didn't have the money to redo the tee blocks but instead introduced the Silver course to take some of the load off the affected tee blocks (the Silver course uses a different set of yellow tee blocks so spreads the load a little more evenly and gives the Tee blocks a chance to recover).

Again this isn't ideal but bought us some time.

Situation today

Our Tee blocks are in a poor state. The Yellow tee blocks which we are using now for the White/Silver courses are too small and sometimes wrongly positioned for the amount of play they get.

Other Tees blocks are poorly designed, with split levels that are unnecessary and limit the available playing space.

On most blocks the grass and playing surface has deteriorated over time, with many blocks not level and with poor cover of grass.

The overall plan

We want to redo <u>ALL</u> the tee blocks across the course, ensuring they are all up to standard, correctly positioned, level, properly sized and with good quality grass (we want to change the Tee blocks to a Rye grass variant – this is a quicker growing, tougher grass that should improve the grass cover on the Tee blocks)

We expect this to take us roughly four years – there is only so many blocks we can do in a year and only so much we can afford in a year.

The total cost of this work will be around \$200k (spread over four years). At this stage we expect the bulk of the work will be done by MCL, overseen by Rohan and his team (we need specialist contractors with the right equipment and expertise)

We have also decided (after some debate) to do this hole by hole e.g. do all the tee blocks on a hole at the same time. It's more practical to do it this way rather than spreading temporary tees and contractors across the course. It also ensures we bring all the tee blocks up to a good standard.

What's the Plan for this year?

This year we will be doing four holes - #'s 4, 8, 15 and 17

The plan for each hole is;

Hole no 4 – resurface black and blue tee blocks. Reposition/rebuild the yellow tee block, moving towards the middle of the fairway away from the fence line and the surrounding trees/shrubs.

Hole no 8 – resurface the black and blue tee blocks. Resurface and enlarge (double the size) of the yellow tee block

Hole no 15 – resurface black / blue tee block. Rebuild yellow tee block, enlarging it and removing trees surrounds the block

Hole no 17 – rebuilt black/blue tee block, relevelling it and clearing trees/shrubs around the block. Relevel and resurface the existing yellow tee block

The first stage is underway – the existing tee blocks that are being rebuilt have been sprayed with Roundup to kill the grass. Temporary tees are place until Friday. After this, the Tees will be back in play until the Contractor starts on course (scheduled for 28 October).

At this stage we expect the work to take a few weeks and hope to have the tees back in play early in the new year.

Once we've seen the results, had a chance to evaluate the work and the lessons learnt, we will then work through plans for the next lot of tees in 2026.

We hope this gives you some understanding of what's planned and why. It's a big commitment for the Club but one that's consistent with the Club's focus of continually improving the quality of the Course.

It will mean some short term disruption and the use of temporary tees on the affected holes. We hope you'll bear with us while this happens – we believe the long term results will be well worth the short term pain.

Finally a special thanks to Rohan and his team – its going to be a busy couple of months for them as they oversee this work plus the normal busy spring season with coring, spring grass growth etc. On behalf of the Club, we appreciate the great work your guys are doing!!!
