Subscriptions and Direct Debit payment option

We are nearly ready to send out next year's subscription invoices. Andrew hopes to have all of these emailed to you by the middle of next week (17th August).

As noted in the newsletter several weeks ago, subs for next year are increasing at around the rate of inflation – we've held subs steady for several years but the cost pressures are simply too great for us not to increase subs this year.

Having said that, the Club is in good shape, with more members, strong green fees and continues to be in a solid financial position. We expect the course next year to be in even better shape, especially now that the Club has invested in new coring and sand spreading machines. We are excited by these purchases and expect this to make a significant difference around the course in the coming 12 months.

Another change we're introducing is the option to pay your subscriptions by **Direct Debit (DD).**

At the moment members can pay their subs in monthly or fortnightly instalments by setting up an Automatic Payment. This is OK but every payment needs to be manually reconciled and recorded, which takes a <u>full 8 hours each month</u>. We recover some of this by charging members an admin fee (\$20 last year, increasing to \$40 this year).

However, DD payments can be automatically reconciled via the Dot golf / Xero systems which the Club now uses. This reduces the manually reconciling work almost entirely.

The Club would encourage all members who want to pay by instalment to use the DD payment option. To further encourage members to make the switch, there will be no Admin fee charged this year on members paying by DD.

If you want to pay by DD, simply pick up a DD form from the Pro Shop, fill it in and drop it back to the Pro Shop, ideally before 1 September and we will look after the rest. Easy!!

If you want to continue paying by AP, you can, but we will charge you the \$40 admin fee to recover some of the time and effort required to process your payments.

And of course, the simplest and preferred option for payment of subs is in full into the Clubs bank account before the end of September.

RINGERS - 2022

The tenth round of 2022 Winter Ringers competition was played under overcast cool conditions with the distinct threat to rain imminent from the south. Again, the scores contained within the MOTD results, showed that many found it difficult to break par on the day. The greens continue to have good consistent speed and were rolling true.

This week saw more players tackle the shorter course off the Silver tees, given that a number of them participated in the Urlwin Rosebowl Team Matchplay Trophy.

After Round 10, with the field having broken up into three separate groups with the lower handicapped group containing 9 players and the other 2 groups with 18 players each. Please note that these groups are dynamic, in that if your calculated weekly average handicap index for the

competition is on the borderline of the designated group classification, this could mean that there are possible switches in groups for those players.

In Group A - Mal Ashton (10.36) has maintained the lead on 55.457, from Paul Snape (10.9) moving up a spot into second on 57.143, with Mel Newburn (5.7) moving up one place into third on 57.289. David Harvey (10.9) has slipped down two places to now hold fourth position on 58.089 with John Gaw (6.8) moving up three spots to lie in fifth position on 58.171.

In Group B - Lex Halford (12.9) has surged into the lead, moving up four places to now lead narrowly on 53.060, from David Cross (16.9) moving up a spot on 53.140, with Alan Wicks (20.4) dropping two spots to be in third place on 53.644. Phil Olsen (17.9) dropped down two places to now hold fourth position on 54.075 with Clinton Chase (13.5) holding fifth position on 54.513.

In Group C - Keith Yardley (25.2) has taken over the lead on 48.760, from Jonathan Kemp (21.6) who holds second spot on 49.378, with Chris Cottrell (26.4) holding third on 49.611. Alan Smith (31.4) continues his move up, to now hold fourth position on 50.600 with Peter Marsh (38.1) slotting into fifth position on 50.900.

The hardest hole is currently Hole # 15 with only two birdies, followed by Holes # 8 and # 13 with three birdies on each, followed closely behind are Holes # 2, # 5, # 9 and # 10 with five birdies recorded on each. The easiest birdie hole for the Ringers field remains Hole # 12 with 17 birdies, followed by Hole # 1 with 14 birdies and Hole # 14 with 13 birdies.

As the field compresses and the margins begin to narrow, there are now 36 players who have managed to secure a better than net score of 60. There were an additional 16 birdies recorded by the Ringers field this week, taking the field tally to 129, Mel Newburn (5.7) now heads the birdies or better statistics with 10 birdies. Spencer Wicks (5.2) and John Gaw (6.8) have eight birdies each with Jason McCauley (5.5), Mal Ashton (10.6) and Lex Halford (12.9) are next on 7 birdies. Please remember to hand in your signed scorecards after the completion of your round into the Pro Shop so that they can be processed as part of the MOTD competition field results. This will enable your round score to be picked up from Dotgolf to be processed as part of your Ringers compilation.

The long-range weather for Round 11, is forecasting for a fine day, with light winds, with a high of 13 forecasted after an overnight low of -3. So it looks promising for the weekend golf even though it will be a frosty start for those teeing off early and we should see a larger participation by the Ringers competitors.

Could I respond to the request by saying that the Match Committee has entered this match as members have asked to play different competitions and would like more variety in the programme. ions. I understand some members do not enjoy playing the Yellow tees, but it is winter, and the course is playing long. The Yellow tee blocks are rated for all and are available for use by all. The Match Committee try to create a programme which is balanced and provides some variety. Rules of Golf

Question: Can I touch the sand when my ball is in a bunker or move a stone / leaf / piece of

bark or wood near my ball?

Answer Rule 12.2 Playing Ball in Bunker

This rule applies both during a round and while play is stopped under Rule 5.7a.

12.2a Removing Loose Impediment and Moveable Obstructions

Before playing a ball in a bunker, a player may remove loose impediments (stone / leaf / piece of bark or wood) under Rule 15.1 and moveable obstructions under 15.2.

This includes any reasonable touching or movement of sand in the bunker that happens while doing so.

12.2b Restrictions on Touching sand in Bunker

WhenTouching Sand Results in Penalty. Before making a stroke at a ball in a bunker, a player must not:

Deliberately touch sand in the bunker with a hand, club, rake or other to test the condition of the sand to learn information for the next stroke, or

- Touch sand in the bunker with a club:
- In the arearight in front of or right behind the ball(except as allowed under Rule 7.1a in fairly searching for a ball or under Rule 12.2a in removing a loose impediment or moveable obstruction),
- In making a practice swing, or
- In making the backswing for a stroke.

Again, to clarify for members Coringa's Local Rules and The Rules of Golf allow for a player to recover their ball from the water in a bunker and drop the ball in a dry area within the bunker. But if there is no dry area of sand available you can drop your ball a club's length outside the bunker in an area no closer to the pin and where the ball entered the bunker without any penalty!
