Not too much to write about this week,

What a horrible day it was last Saturday, I received a txt from my playing partner asking if I was playing, the sun was shining at the time so I said yes, and head out to the course.

It was very strange to see only a handful of cars in the carpark, and within minutes of getting to the course it started raining.

Once the decision was made to close the course, I volunteered to head out on to the course to inform the people out there,

There was no health and safety risk, so people could continue to play if they chose to, but the match has been cancelled.

Surprisingly most of those players continued to play on, although they all agreed, putting on the greens was impossible.

What would posses me to volunteer to go out on the course and get wet?

There was a group of men in the pro shop, now that they weren't going to play golf, they were roped into helping to carry the new fridge upstairs,

I helped with the last fridge, so I already know how difficult this job is, I'm getting out of here!!!

A big thanks to all the helpers who moved the fridges around, not an easy task.

READY GOLF REMINDER – Don't stand around watching your mates play their shots – go directly to your own ball.

Potentially one of the biggest contributors to slow play, is when all players in the group walk to one ball, and then they all stand there waiting for that first person to play their shot, before they all move off together to the next ball.

I'm sure there are good reasons why people do this,

- To spend more time talking with their mates?
- It feels rude to walk off and leave your mate by themselves?
- You don't want to get in front of the person playing their shot
- They just don't know better?

Going directly to your own ball gives you more time to asses your options and make your shot selections, it is definitely not rude to walk off to find your ball, it's recommended.

If your ball is ahead of your playing partner's ball, we don't want you to get in their way or put yourself in danger to get hit by their ball, but the course has a lot of space, most often you can safely walk ahead without endangering yourself,

Once your partners have played their shots you should be ready to pull the trigger and hit your own shot within a matter of seconds.

REPAIRING PITCH MARKS AND DIVOTS
