COURSE NEWS

Green speed as of Wednesday is 10 feet. We would like to thank Barry Stringer for his help cleaning up the tree on the 14th, this allowed the team to deal with the unfortunate loss of the huge willow on the 17th hole. The loss of this tree has completely changed the hole and now we have to think of what we replace it with.

The rough hasn't been cut as we are waiting on a replacement part (which has arrived) – the team started on the rough today and hope to get a few more holes done before the weekend. Everything else has been maintained to our normal high standard.

Next week we will be doing a wire to wire cut plus fertilizing greens and tees.

TUESDAY CREW

The final week under the Bosses watchful eye (more on this in Daves comment section below). The skilled work was busy erecting the new 'Pace of Play' signs (one on the 1st hole outlining "Ready golf") and one on the 10th hole reinforcing expectations in terms of the expected pace of play.

The unskilled labour were dispatched to the 4th fairway where they spent the morning weed eating around the plants on the left hand side of the fairway (actually this was time well spent – a few of the plants were getting completely shut out by the tall grass and weeds growing, so we will need to keep this work up in the other areas we've planted as well).

Next week we are looking to hiring the chipper again to get through the slash pile on the 16th so all help appreciated.

We also will be needing as many hands as we can get for the coring, especially on Wednesday and Thursday, 13th and 14th December – book it in the diary now.....

Rules Questions

An interesting rules question arose on Saturday in the clubhouse, and although I felt I understood the rule, I still decided to seek clarification,

local rule - alternative to stroke and distance for ball lost or out of bounds.

Question – I have hit my ball out of bounds, so I play a provisional ball, My provisional ball has also gone out of bounds, since it is a provisional and not in play, can I apply the local rule to my first ball. Therefore, I would be playing my 4th shot from the fairway.

There are 2 different responses to this, 1x from the R&A, and 1x from the USGA,

USGA – once a provisional ball has been played, the local rule is no longer available. You would need to play another provisional ball, hitting 5 off the tee.

R & A – If both the original ball and the provisional ball are out of bounds or lost, the local rule may be applied to the provisional ball.

You would be playing your 6th shot from the fairway.
