## **RICHARD KINGSBURY - AGM, WESTPAC LOAN REPAYMENT**

As I'm sure most of you are aware we have our AGM coming up on the 25<sup>th</sup> November, 9.30 at the Clubrooms. It would be nice to see a good turnout – the Club has had a great year, continues to be travelling well and its great to just take a little time to reflect on how well we are doing and how far we've come, particularly in the last five years or so.

Continuing on the good news front – this week, the Club took another significant step forward.

### **WE HAVE FULLY PAID OF OUR WESTPAC LOAN!!!**

The Club has had a loan with Westpac in some form or another every since the Clubrooms were built. Westpac are like any of the big banks – fine to deal with when things are going well but (understandably) lose their sense of humour when you struggle to make loan repayments (as we were six years ago).

Its great to now repay this loan in full and finally clear the debt (not to mention avoiding the 11.1% floating loan interest rate they proposed).

We still have about \$180k of debt we need to repay with other parties, but we are slowly chipping away at this as well and look forward to some day soon when the Club will be fully debt free!!

## **COURSE NEWS**

Green speed is a little lower sitting 9.8 feet.

This is due to the primo (growth regulator) not being spray as we want the greens to start growing for coring in three and a bit weeks' time, also the Poa grass is flowering (that slightly yellow look in the greens) which doesn't help.

It's been a very busy week out on the course. The staff have been nonstop mowing the course and even got the rough done wire to wire. But with a busy week there's always hick ups, the fairway mower decided to blow a Hydraulic hose Thursday morning on the 6th fairway which change plans with afterhours mowing to get the job done.

Next week we will still keep up with the rough, give the greens a fertilize and start setting up for coring.

## **RANGE BALLS**

We've just purchased 2,700 2<sup>nd</sup> hand range balls of Russley Golf Club (they needed to replace their range balls with lower compression balls as they continue to have issues with range balls hitting nearby buildings). This should top up our stock of balls for a while but if anyone has old golf balls sitting around their garage, please drop them off in the Pro Shop so we can keep a good supply up.

We've also ordered some more sand buckets as these also seem to mysteriously go missing.....

## **TUESDAY CREW**

Big job on Tuesday as Richard Kingsbury took charge, hired a new, higher spec chipper and set the team to work. Here they are hard at work, feeding the beast.

And “hey presto”, end of the day all the mountains of slash by the 16<sup>th</sup> fairway have been reduced to a couple of piles of chip which we can now use around the course. Still more tidying up to do but its looking a lot better – great job guys!!!

### **Saturday Tee Time Availability:**

I have had discussions on the availability of Saturday tee times with some of our members and the Alpha Group. It has been agreed to make tee times available to general members until 11.49.

## **AND NOW....**
