LEAF RULE - local rule in play as of Saturday 30th March 2024

With the onset of Autumn, leaves are starting to fall quite heavily in a few patches around the course, In some of these area's it is often difficult to locate your ball, therefore you can without penalty drop another ball in the area you estimate your ball to be hiding.

***Remember this rule only applies if you are virtually certain your ball lies in an area that is affected by fallen leaves. ***

COMBINATION TEE,

As indicated in last week's newsletter,

Coringa now has a new course option, using a combination of Black, Blue and Yellow tee blocks, You will see this on the scorecard and the computer as "Mixed"

The course stroke rating is 71.4. (eg the blue course rating is 72.2. or white / silver – 70) It is intended to provide a fun alternative to the usual tee blocks we play, with a mixture of easy, and difficult holes.

Example – B = Black. U = Blue. Y = Yellow

- 1B tee off hole 1 from the Black tee,
- 2Y tee off hole 2 from the Yellow tee.
- 3U tee off hole 3 from the Blue tee.

RULE OF THE MONTH - April 2024 Embedded ball: (Courtesy of Canterbury Golf Referees Association)

Unless local rules say otherwise, free relief for an embedded ball can only apply to a ball in the general area,

but there is an exception:

 on the putting green: the ball (once marked) may be lifted and cleaned, the ground repaired, and the ball replaced on its original spot.

There is no free relief if:

- The ball is embedded in a penalty area
- The ball is embedded in sand, unless that part of the ground is cut to fairway height or less.
- There is Interference by anything else other than the embedding itself e.g. a stroke cannot be made because the ball lies under a bush.
- The ball is not in it's own pitch-mark it is unreasonable to assume that a ball that bounces over a hill and out of sight and later found in a pitch-mark that it is in it's own pitch-mark.
