PACE OF PLAY REVIEW

Pace of play has unfortunately become an ongoing issue at the club, with longer Saturday rounds becoming the norm. I know there is a bit of frustration, I also know the match committee are just as frustrated as you, we play as well, we know it is slow, and we hear all your frustrations.

Members suggestions,

we hear a lot of suggestions on what the problem is, and what should be done to fix it.

We take everything on board, we hear it, we digest it and consider all possibilities.

we want to find the answer, and we want your suggestions to be the solution so we can all get a break from this. But it is just not that simple. for every solution there are always consequences we need to consider.

Your thoughts and suggestions are always welcome.

Why is it slower now.

We know that the more people who are playing, the more the course slows down.

Think of it like rush hour traffic, during the day traffic is manageable, and you can drive around the city without too much delay, however during rush hour, there are many more cars on the road at the same time, and traffic slows to a crawl.

The same thing happens on the golf course.

During the summer months, we have a lot more daylight, and the field can spread out a little more, leaving gaps in the tee sheet.

During the winter months, shorter daylight hours mean the field is packed closer together, and we get this rush hour effect.

As the days get longer, we will likely see a few more gaps in the field allowing a little more breathing space for the course, and therefore a corresponding decrease in round times.

But for right now, this Saturday is showing a packed field, so it will be slow.

What are we doing about it?

The match committee met last Saturday to discuss this single topic.

Nothing was off the table, if it could help solve this problem we were willing to look at it no matter how big or small the suggestion was.

One of the realities we learned is, there are many things that are simply beyond the control of the match-committee,

For all the decisions that are beyond our control, we have 100% confidence in the people who are tasked with making those decisions. - everyone wants the same thing, and everyone has Coringa's best interests at heart.

so, for the match-committee we can only focus on the things that fall within our purview.

- We have already followed recommendations from all the major golfing bodies, to provide suitable teeing options for all golfing abilities,
- We have removed unnecessary Stroke rounds from the playing program,
- We will re-run the ready golf education campaign we ran last year,
- We will have Course Marshalls out on course (Saturday's)

Course Marshalls

The match committee are going to be getting out onto the course to see what is happening out there, and to identify if there are any area's where we can make gains to improve pace of play.

Rest assured, we are not coming out there to hassle anyone.

We are all volunteers, we are not looking to become Police Officers,

We will be following strict guidelines that are set out to ensure no one is unfairly treated.

We know there are natural ebbs and flows on the course, and everyone falls behind from time to time, We will be looking to see that any groups who have fallen behind, are making every effort to get back on track, and only if you are having trouble getting back into position, then we may approach you <u>to see if we can help.</u>

This Saturday you will see Brian Docherty (morning), and myself, (Vance) (afternoon) out on the course, we will get around the course, but will often park up in positions where we can view multiple

holes at once, so if you see us sitting there, don't be alarmed, we are not necessarily watching your group.

WINTER RINGERS

The Winter Ringers competition completed its sixth week, with two additional competitors to the field. The handicap indexes ranging between 1.720 to 33.300. If you decide to enter in the next few weeks, then any previous qualifying rounds played and recorded on the dotgolf website will be included in the composition of your Ringers score.

After Round 6 off either the Blue or White tees for the men and Yellow tees for the women, we saw Gordon McCoy (21.120) jump up 5 places to take the lead over the field, with an impressive improvement of 4.870 to his net score, bringing it down to 52.880, his lead to 1.820 ahead of last weeks leader Peter Marsh (33.300) with a net score of 54.700, followed by Alan Wicks (19.867) who remains in third place on 55.133. So at this early stage, there are now 37 competitors who are currently under net par but with another 7 rounds to play, the leaderboard will change dramatically over the coming weeks and the range of net scores in the field compresses.

There were an additional 11 new birdies or better recorded bringing the total to 90, with the only competitor to score multiple birdies in their round this week, namely Murray Angus (13.117) with 2 birdies, on the front 9. The other highlight of the round was the fourth eagle attained by the field on

Hole # 14 by Leighton Sparks (10.625). There are now 33 players with a birdie or better. Sixteen of the birdies or better have been scored on Hole # 12, with two of them being eagles, with the next best being Hole # 14 with 12 including two eagles. The Hardest hole to attain birdies or better are Hole # 9, with Holes # 2,8 and 18 being the next hardest.

MEMBERS CORNER

Ready Golf Reminder – kindly provided by one of our committee members.

As we are experiencing full fields on Saturdays, we would like to remind all players that in the best interests of all, we need to ensure we are all doing everything we can to maintain an enjoyable pace of play. Ready Golf plays a major part in acheiving that goal so please review the rules of Ready Golf below. Please take responsibility for ensuring the group you are playing with plays Ready Golf.

The Rules of Ready Golf

"Ready Golf" Means thinking ahead so that you are ready to play when it is your turn. Ready Golf applies everywhere-on tees, fairways and on the greens.

- **Teeing Off:** The player with the honour should be ready to hit first. If that player is not ready, then someone else tee off. Remember to watch all the group members tee shots so that errant tee shots can be located quickly. Also mark you card inbetween other group members tee shots, so that you can watch their tee shots.
- On The Fairway: "Ready Golf" means all players should go to their ball as soon as possible and get ready to play their shot. While waiting to hit, players should survey their shot, select the club and stand at their ball ready to hit when it is their turn. Hint: walk down the side of the fairway to

reach your ball, staying safe and keeping an eye on members of your group. If you are ready to play and they aren't play your shot.

• On The Green: "Ready Golf" means getting ready to putt before it is your turn.

Players should line up their putts while others are putting so they are ready to putt when it is their turn. "Ready Golf" also means putting continously if the ball is not in someones line and if the player does not need to spend a lot of time surveying the next putt, putt out.

If the first two players have putted out, they should proceed to the next tee while the remainder of the group putts out.

Farthest From The Hole: There is no reason "Ready Golfers" can't play in the order of the farthest from the hole. The person farthest from the hole should be ready to play first. When someone hits a shot, but is still farthest from the hole, the next player should hit to keep continuous play.

- In Summary:
- 1/ Walk to your ball as soon as possible, so that you can choose your club and think about your shot in advanvce.
- 2/ When a ball is lost, hit your shot and then assist to find the lost ball. Remember the 3 minute rule.
- 3/ Walk down the sides of the fairways and then approach your ball from the centre.
- 4/ When on the green, line up your putt and be ready to putt when it is yourn turn.
- 5/ Ensure you are on the first Tee ready to hit 3 minutes before your Tee time, if the group in front is out of range, proceed.

If we all adopt the Ready Golf principles we should have faster and more enjoyable rounds of golf. It only takes one slow group to disturb the flow of all the groups following, so if you find your group is losing ground on the group in front, speak with your group and suggest a concerted effort to catch up, in many cases it doesn't take a lot of effort to catch up.
