COURSE NEWS

Green speed on Wednesday morning was 11.4 feet (just for comparison the US Open is about 14 feet). The course is once again very wet underfoot, we have had 31mm of rain so far this week and it doesn't look like it's going to let up until Friday lunchtime, so if using a golf cart please take extra care.

The greens have had an application of Iron just to colour them up and take the winter look away.

We have also planted six new trees on the golf course this week, two of them have been planted on the left-hand side of 4, one short of the willows and another just pass the willows. The four other trees were planted in the big block between 10/12 and 16, this is the start of the ongoing tree replacement plan.

We have also gone back to some root pruning areas and tidy up some rocks what were left behind.

A few things we golfers have to remind ourselves though the winter months,

Pitch marks - we have seen a huge increase in pitch marks on the greens, if we do not repair them our greens will deteriorate quickly and your greens will become bumpy and bear spots will a pair. So please even if it's not your pitch mark just repair it.

This also goes with **divots** on the course. The best action is to replace the divot. Filling the divot with sand is better than just leaving it, but the replacing the actual grass divot will result in better fairways long term.

GUR, all root pruning trenches are GUR.

We have six new trees and all are Staked trees, so we ask all members to please remember - you MUST take relief of two club lengths away from these new trees

Canterbury Golf Women's Forum. Last Friday, Jenny Ahn and I attended the Canterbury Golf Women's Forum. The following is information that we were asked to pass onto players.

- 1. If you are playing Interclub and or in any Canterbury Golf event, make sure you have the R&A app on your phone so that if there is a dispute you have the rule book at your fingertips. Should you be unable to resolve an issue in a timely fashion, then at the end of the game, Do Not sign the card until you have spoken to an official.
- 2. Canterbury Golf have developed a document related to Pace of play. This will be enforced at all interclub games and Canterbury Golf Tournaments from August 2025. Both Jenny and I have a copy of the document if you want to read it or go onto the Canterbury Golf Website.
- 3. When Hosting an Interclub event, make sure that you have all the current relevant documents with you. These can be found on the CG website.
- 4. If you need to clean your ball before hitting it, there is no longer a requirement for you to mark the ball if you can place it back from where you picked it up from.
- 5. The 40 second rule. Once you reach your ball and it is your turn to hit, then you have 40 seconds to do so.
- 6. 9 Hole Interclub. Next year they are going to introduce an additional category, Match Play. This will have a capped Handicap yet to be determined but probably somewhere between 20 and 25. The stableford Competition will continue. However, players will not be able to play in both the Stableford and Match play competitions.
- 7. Finally, Mike Millward from CG was the guest speaker. He talked about what he does at CG and that he is retiring in September.
