Welcome back to Level 2 golf!

Hopefully, life can return to 'normal' very quickly, and spring has well and truly arrived – the very best time of the year to play GOLF!

SATURDAY'S MATCH

The Covid interruption has meant changes to the original programme which are detailed below.

The main changes are:

- the Club Championship programme will begin next week, Saturday, the 18th of September, and
- the Urlwin Rosebowl matches are scheduled to follow the club championships on the 23rd and 30th of October.

The planned match for this Saturday is a Stableford match off the Silver tees (Note – the strokes were recently updated for the Silver tees, based on the actually scores entered in the last 4 months or so).

The Shootout continues but is suspended for those competing in the match play rounds of the club championships – from 2nd, 9th, and 16th October.

CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

The **Coringa Club Championships** will now begin with the first qualifying round on the 18th of September. The second is the following week 25th of September – the best ONE of the two to count for qualification and seeding purposes.

Eight in each grade to qualify ie three rounds of match play scheduled for the 2nd and 9th of October with the finals on the 16th of October.

Five grades: (Handicap index)

Senior - 8.6 and below; Intermediate - 8.7 to 14.3; Junior "A" - 14.4 to 20.2; Junior "B" - 20.3 and above; and Masters (age 65+ and no handicap restriction.)

Senior – Black tees; Intermediate & Junior "A" – Blue tees; Junior "B" & Masters – White tees.

NB. All Masters results are decided on Handicap. (Handicaps current, ie. The handicap printed on your card on the day.)

If you are unable to play your match on the due date you may play any time before the date of the next due round. Please let Dave Harvey know if you need to do this.

A notice to trophy holders from last year – please return these to the pro shop asap and it would be appreciated if you could engrave them.

The Blank Cup competition for 2021 continues this Sunday at Russley with a double round – v Clearwater (tee off 8am), and v Russley (tee off at 1pm). President's grade interclub also starts this weekend with a home match against Hagley this Sunday at 9.30

COVID rules under L2

We have had a couple of days now under the new rules for play in L2. So far, so good but ask that everyone please be tolerant and help us as we navigate this tricky period.

Main things to remember

- You must register (tracing app or manually) when you enter the course **and** when you enter the Café/Bar
- Keep your 2m distance where possible
- Only 5 people at one time in the ProShop (4 players plus staff)
- When inside, ideally you should be wearing a mask whenever you aren't eating or drinking inside
- Toilets are open, bunker rakes are back, but pins stay in the holes at all times and no swapping of cards

Lets all do our bit (but not get too carried away with what other people are doing) and most importantly, enjoy being back out in the fresh air playing golf with our mates.

Course improvements

There has been a lot of work going on around the course. The Spring grass growth is kicking off and while the fairways and greens look great, the rough is starting to grow (which rightly places a premium on finding fairways).

The Tuesday group got through another good days work – have a look next time you're on the course at the area around the toilet between the 4th and 5th holes. The guys have cleared a lot of the under-growth, cut back the creeper that was taking over the area and partly trimmed back some of the surrounding trees.
