**NOTE:** As you can see from the programme the White and Silver tees are both in use and are equivalent courses. Which course you are playing on any day will be clear when you print your card. This is to spread the use of the tee blocks to allow time for natural repair.

### WINTER RINGERS

Another cold frosty morning greeted the early starters for Round 6 and the cold temperatures never rose above single digits for the entire round. The greens were slow and any breaking putts required an adjustment to pace and alignment to get it homing in on its final destination. This week sees the field broken down into three groups based on the players current handicap indexes. Remember the current groupings are not final and are only indicative given that each player's handicap index can change after each round and therefore redefine the composition of the Group especially for those players on the range borders. Again, Group A has the smaller number of competitors with 9 so their range is more compact to ensure fair competitiveness, and this allows for 15 players each in Groups B and Group C.

In Group A, Mal Ashton on 59.0 leads with a slender margin of 0.4 over Brian Docherty, followed by Spencer Wicks on 61.87 and Isaac Preece on 61.8. Only 6.0 shots covers this Group, with three rounds remaining.

In Group B, sees the first four players within a range of 0.7, with Kevin King leading from Walter Scott, David Cross and Murray Angus. In the most competitive group the first 10 players are within a range of 4.4 strokes.

In Group C, Jonathan Kemp leads by only 0.2 over his closest rival Gordon McCoy, with Alan Wicks only 0.4 further behind. There is a gap of 1.3 to Chris Cottrell who lies in fourth.

Last week saw another 12 birdies recorded by the Ringers field during the round. That brings the overall total to 75 birdies or better. Currently Mal Ashton has seven birdies, followed by Melissa Newburn and Walter Scott with five birdies with six players, Chris Choie, Lex Halford, Paul Snape, Peter Marsh, Murray Angus and Spencer Wicks each having four birdies.

The weather outlook for the weekend is not looking that great with Saturday forecasted rain with light winds with a high of 13 after an overnight low of 5. This is moving week so bring on your Agame and put yourself in a more challenging position further up the leader board. Again, you'll have the choice of two tees to play off, Black or Silver/White.

## Pace of Play

Winter conditions do slow things down a little, BUT!

Four and a quarter hour (plus) last Saturday was better, but it is still too long! Do make sure you are ON TIME and keep up with the four ahead. The Black tees again this Saturday mean this is even more important.

### **Course Care**

I know this is a repeated message - BUT IT STILL APPLIES!

With winter conditions now upon us try and keep away from any muddy patches with your trundlers and keep carts well away from greens and DO NOT drive between bunkers and the greens, especially in the marked off areas. If you can, park up behind the green. If possible always try to travel in the rough and walk across to your ball when you reach it.

As a player / member we need your help to keep the course in the best condition possible. The course committee would like to remind you that that this involves raking bunkers – (even if you didn't make the footprint), to repair any pitch marks – (even if they are not yours) and to carry a sand bucket and repair divots that you see – (even if they are not yours!)
