COURSE NEWS

Greens continue to roll smoothly – speed is holding up well, 10.9 feet

This week we have had some really big frosts out on the course, which has allowed us to get out the chainsaws and do some selective tree trimming around the course. We have also been out and cut the fairways which are looking great for this time of year. Now that we have two fairway mowers, the time cutting fairways has come down to 3-hours instead of the normal 7-hour mow time.

We have also been busy this week doing some bunker maintenance, moving sand around trying to flatten some of the bunkers out so you don't have those scary downhill lies.

Next week, we are hoping to start the coring of fairways (weather dependant), so if you do see the tractor out on the fairways, please give way and let him do his job

Finally – please, please, repair your pitch marks on the greens – we put a huge amount of effort into maintaining the greens, they are arguably the best feature of the course and it's a real shame when they are pock-marked with unrepaired pitch marks!!

SUBSCRIPTIONS

At Monday's Board meeting we agreed on the subscriptions for next year (see the full table below)

The key points to note are

- Slight increase of 2.5%, matching current rate of inflation
- Removal of the 1 year introductory and 3yr subscriptions. The Board have decided we will no
 longer offer discounted deals for new members, everyone should pay the same (though the
 Board may consider one off deals for groups of new members where appropriate).
- Removal of the 5% married couple's discount. The married discount is complicated to administer and is a little out dated these days.
- Introduction of a new 6 day subscription (Sunday Friday). This replaces the current mid-week subscription, but is slightly cheaper. We are looking to encourage new members (and maybe existing members) to take up this option and hopefully lessen the pressure on Saturday mornings.
- For existing members shifting categories such 1st year introductory members who joined after 1 January, members shifting out of the U35 category this year and 3yr members whose term is coming to an end, they will be offered a special transition subscription of \$975 next year.

The new subscription invoices will be produced around mid August. If anyone would like to change categories, is intending to resign, or has any concerns/queries, please let us know – office@coringagolfclub.co.nz.

TARGET TIMES ON THE SCORECARDS

We've turned on a new feature in dot golf – a target time to start each hole. This is printed on the right hand side of your score card (albeit in fairly small printing). The idea is to remind us all what time we should be teeing off on each hole and will give us an idea if we are keeping up the required Pace of Play as we go around the course (this is especially important for those of us who play early Saturday morning – any delays we cause are magnified latter in the day).

We are all aware that Pace of Play is a contentious issue at the moment, with the shorter daylight hours and resulting in fuller / condensed fields causing issues.

There's no magic answer to this – the Board and the Match Committee have been looking at this problem periodically for years (as have Canterbury Golf and other Clubs in Christchurch).

We will keep looking for longer term solutions e.g. changes to the course layout etc, but in the meantime please do what you can within your playing groups to keep up the Pace of Play.

One of the easy ideas under "Ready Golf" – once the first two in your group have putted out, go to the next tee and tee off as soon as the fairway is clear. This keeps play moving and hopefully ensures you're keeping pace with the group in front.

TREE DONATION

John Patten has donated two sizeable Kowhai trees to the club for planting near the seventh green, where John recorded three holes in one. The trees were brought from the Big Tree Company, Sawyers Arms Road.

The Tuesday crew will work with Rohan and get the trees planted in the ground next week.

The Winter Ringers competition completed its third week after an additional 2 registered competitors bring the total to 37, with handicap indexes ranging between 1.5 to 32.8. Again, the entry sheet was not displayed on the counter for those players who started before 9.00am but if you decide to enter in the next few weeks, then any previous qualifying rounds played and recorded on the dotgolf website will be included in the composition of your Ringers score.

This is a competition that everyone can compete in and have a fair chance of winning and it does not favour the high handicappers.

The entry fee is \$10 and field is divided into three equal groups that are dynamic, that is the composition of each group is only finalised after completion of the last round and those with handicap indexes that border the ranges may swap between groups depending on their weekly changes in their handicap index.

Your weekly round scores will be picked up from Dotgolf wesite and a weekly Ringers leaderboard will be published on Facebook, the Coringa website and on the notice board in the Pro Shop.

Test your golfing prowess and beat the course hole by hole over a thirteen week period, have some laughs and earn some bragging rights over your fellow competitors. If you're having a bad round to start with, there's always something to play for as you begin to target the remaining holes left on your scorecard to improve on your Ringers score.

Get involved, don't be the one that's missing out on all the FUN...challenge yourself and see what your lowest gross/net score could be if you had the perfect composite round. Get rewarded for your efforts.

There'll be an entry sheet on the Pro Shop counter, next to the cash register, register your name on the sheet and pay your entry fee to Barry.

After Round 3 off either the Blue or Silver tees for the men and Yellow tees for the women, we saw Phil Olsen (16.2) overtake the lead over the field with an improvement of 6.10 to his net score, bringing it down to 60.800, only 0.400 ahead of newcomer Chris Innes (14.8) with a net score of 61.200, followed by Iain Findlater (14.1) who improved 21 places on 61.867. So at this early stage, there are now 34 competitors who are currently under net par but with another 10 rounds to play, the leaderboard will change dramatically over the coming weeks and the range of net scores in the field compresses.

There were 18 birdies or better recorded, with a number of competitors scoring multiple birdies in their round this week, namely Graham Free (7.7) with an eagle and 3 birdies, Duncan Shaw-Brown with 2 birdies as a result of two 2's on the back 9 and Iain Findlater (14.6) with 2 birdies also as a result of two 2,'s. There are 28 players with a birdie or better. Fourteen of the birdies have been scored on Hole # 12, with the next best being Hole # 13 with 7. The Hardest holes to attain birdies or better are Holes # 2,8,9 and 18.

Graham Free's eagle was secured on Hole # 12 and was the second one recorded by the field, the first was achieved by Spencer Wicks in the first week round also on Hole #12. The highlight of this weeks round was the birdie scored by Greg Carr (31.4) on Hole # 3
