News from the Course - Rohan

Firstly, I'd like to thank the members on Saturday afternoon for their understanding with the course closure due to the dangerous windy conditions.

There was damage on and off the course, with a tree falling over down the driveway and some broken trees on holes 4, 10 and 12. There was also a lot of small branches scattered all over the golf course.

We'd like to thank Russell McGregor's (The Boss) and his working bee group who came out on Tuesday and helped clean up all the small branches on the course (more on this below)

Due to the clean-up work this week on the golf course, the tidy up of the practice area has had to be put until next week.

Other news from around the course;

On the **5th green**, as you may be aware, the back right hand side of the green is getting very dry. The staff have completed a water catch test, which showed some differences, and the sprinklers have been adjusted. We will also be following up with an application of wetting agent (which helps the greens absorb water easier). We will be keeping a close eye on this area and if needed, we may put a small sprinkler up the back to help out.

Spring growth has certainly started. The boys have been out cutting all week with the big job of doing a fence-to-fence rough cut. This is a 4 day plus job (as long as everything goes well). They have made good progress and had most of this completed today.

Otherwise, all is looking good, and, most importantly, there's no gale force winds forecast for this weekend!!! Enjoy your golf! - Rohan

MEN'S REPORT

It has been a challenging time for the match committee after the course was correctly closed by the Course Committee on Saturday with trees starting to break and limbs falling with the strong winds. The greens were unplayable went I played late morning and many had only partially completed their rounds. The wind was so strong it wouldn't allow you to mark your ball before it took off! Many players were talking of five and six putts and I think Clinton Chase spoke of a nine putt on number 3; and 'The Boss' (Russell McGregor) was on the green of number 6 and putting for par only to walk off with a 12!

I heard Billy Hallett also found Number 3 a challenging hole. Some of you will know how Billy wanted to buy a new driver and followed the advice of a friend who had recently purchased an XXIO for \$680. Tee times have been reserved from 9.48 am through to 10.42 for the first round Saturday 2nd of October, starting with Masters through to Senior. There were only two entries in the Saturday Women's grade so they will proceed automatically through to the final. The qualifying results and draw for the various grades are available on the website.

Just a reminder of the standard practice for those playing in Club Championships: You are not able to enter the match of the day or enter a card in the shootout, when you are playing in the matchplay rounds.

For those who did not qualify we have an Irish Stableford Match off the white tees.

Just to remind you:

In the Irish Stableford competition the normal Stableford score counts for holes 1 to 6. The Stableford score for holes 7 to 12 are multiplied by 2, and the Stableford scores for holes 13 to 18 are multiplied by 3.

If this is too much to handle the computer will do the calculations for you!

It has been decided that all last Saturday's match fees will be available for members to use in the coming weeks. Barry is to have a printout of the fees paid and will manage the use of the fees, as the members desire. Just let him know.
