CORINGA CLUB CHAMPUIONSHIPS

The **Coringa Club Championships** will begin with the first qualifying round on the 3RD of September. The second is the following week 11th of September – the best ONE of the two to count for qualification and seeding purposes.

Eight in each of the six grades to qualify: ie three rounds of match play scheduled for the 17th and 24th of September with the finals on the 1st of October. If any of the scheduled days are rained out the 8th of October is the reserve day.

Six grades: (Handicap index)

Senior 8.6 and below; Intermediate 8.7 to 14.3Junior "A" 14.4 to 20.2; Junior "B" 20.3 and above; Masters (age 65+ and no handicap restriction), and Women – handicap competition with no handicap restriction. Senior – Black tees; Intermediate & Junior "A" – Blue tees; Junior "B" & Masters – White tees; Women – Yellow tees

NB. All Masters results are decided on Handicap. (Handicaps current, ie. The handicap printed on your card on the day. The lowest handicapped player goes to zero and the other adjusted accordingly.) If you are unable to play your match on the due date you may play any time before the date of the next due round. Please let Dave Harvey know if you need to do this.

Players in the championship match play rounds CANNOT go in the match of the day, or the shootout on that day.

A notice to trophy holders from last year – please return these to the pro shop asap and it would be appreciated if you could engrave them.

Subscriptions and Membership

Similar message to last week – everyone should have their sub invoices by now (any queries, email office@coringagolfclub.co.nz).

People who want to pay by Direct Debit – PLEASE return competed forms to the ProShop (ideally by this weekend). We need to process the forms and send them to the banks before the first payments are due mid September, so please get these forms in ASAP.

In terms of membership numbers – we've processed roughly 55 resignation (a few due to ill health, a few moving to other clubs, but most simply due to people not playing enough to justify another years subscription). However overall membership numbers are still very healthy – roughly 475 playing members, and as you see above we are still adding new members most weeks.

We are really aiming for around 500 playing members – we think this works well financially for the Club while still giving members plenty of opportunity to get on the course.

Course news

We've met with the wood chipper contractor – the course is drying out nicely with this warm weather and he is looking to start on site next Thursday (8th). It should take a week or two.

The areas they are working in will be roped off but please be careful of them when you're on the course.

The rough is starting to take off – the team will be busy mowing, but we all know it's a challenge keeping on top of this during Spring. Coring is still planned for mid-October once Club champs are completed.

RINGERS - 2022

This week saw the Ringers participants have a choice to play off either the Blue or the Silver tees except for the two ladies in the field.

The thirteenth and final round of 2022 Winter Ringers competition was played again under cloudy cool conditions with hardly a breath of wind encountered during the round. It allowed the players to drive long on the fairways and to go pin-seeking with their approaches, the greens were as rolling as good as ever and it's a credit to our hardworking greenkeepers.

This week saw the Ringers participants have a choice to play off either the Blue or the Silver tees except for the two ladies in the field.

After Round 13, with the field having broken up into three separate groups with the lower handicapped group containing 9 players and the other 2 groups with 18 players each. Please note that these groups are dynamic, in that if your calculated weekly average handicap index for the competition is on the borderline of the designated group classification, this could mean that there

are possible switches in groups for those players. There was one interchange of players between Group A and B and it rewarded one of the players.

In Group A - Mal Ashton (10.7) held on to his lead with 54.350, ahead of Mel Newburn (5.7) who held onto second spot on 56.291 after not participating in the last round, with Isaac Preece (8.6) holding onto third on 56.400. Vance Hetaraka (11.2) was the benefactor of a change in Groups moving up from B with James Willetts dropping into Group B, he slotted into fourth on 56.808, with Paul Snape (11.1) dropping into fifth on 56.878.

In Group B - Alan Wicks (20.0) came home with a wet sail and fully inflated spinnaker and swept into the top position with a narrow winning margin of 0.304 on 49.650, from David Cross (17.0) who dropped a spot on 49.954, with Andrew Wight (19.3) improving two places to be in third place on 50.725. Phil Olsen (17.8) dropped two places to be in fourth position on 51.164 with Lex Halford (12.8) dropping two places to fifth position on 51.231.

In Group C - After weeks of seeing a number of lead changes in this Group, it was of no surprise that that we saw another after the final round. In the closest of finishes, it saw Jonathan Kemp (21.7) on 47.273 edge ahead of Alan Smith (31.7) by the miniscule margin of 0.009. Keith Yardley (25.1) dropped a spot to hold third on 47.942, with Peter Marsh (38.2) holding onto fourth on 48.800. Gordon McCoy (23.0) held onto fifth position on 49.000.

The hardest hole proved to be Hole # 15 with only two birdies, followed by Holes # 8 and # 13 with four birdies, followed closely behind by Holes # 2 and # 10, with five birdies recorded on each. The easiest birdie hole for the Ringers field was by far Hole # 12 with an eagle and 21 birdies, followed by Holes # 1 and # 14 with 15 birdies each.

In the end, 41 players who have managed to secure a better than net score of 60. There were an additional eagle and 9 birdies recorded by the Ringers field this week, taking the field tally to 162, Mel Newburn (5.7) now heads the birdies or better statistics with 11 birdies. Spencer Wicks (5.2) and John Gaw (6.8) has nine birdies each, with Isaac Preece ((8.6) on eight birdies. Mal Ashton (10.6) has an eagle and six birdies.

MEN'S REPORT

Well, I'm back, and what a great break in Far North Queensland. Beautiful weather and too much food and alcohol, but those are the things we all enjoy! It's been great to get home and see the weather on the improve and the extending length of daylight!

This Saturday, the 3rd of September, is the first round of our annual Club Championship so a Stroke competition off all the tees Black (Senior), Blue (Intermediate and Junior A) and White (Junior B and Masters). Last year we introduced a Women's Division, and this will continue this year with match play on handicap (no handicap restrictions).

Any affiliated member of the club is able to play and full details are above, so I won't repeat the handicap divisions or tee block requirements again at this stage! If you wish to enter the Club Championship appropriate for your handicap, please put down your name and scores on the sheets provided in the pro shop. Remember, it's only the best eight scores who qualify but you have two chances to register your best score. Last year some members had issues with not playing in the first round and then there was bad weather for the second qualifying round and subsequently failed to register a qualifying score. So please be mindful we have a programme to stick to and coring coming up straight after the club champs. Good luck to those attempting to qualify!

There will be some members who do not wish to enter the Club Championships, so those members have the choice to play whatever tees they wish for two weeks! Again, if your handicap does not fit the grade you choose you cannot change your mind and hope to qualify! There have been for a number of years two ongoing issues associated with the Club Championships. Firstly members put their names down wishing to qualify and then withdraw or wish to play the games at different times to the draw! This year there will be no movement and the match play must be played on the assigned dates which are;

1st Round (Quarter Finals)
2rd Round (Semi Finals)
3rd Round (Final 36 or 18 holes)
17th September.
24th September.
1st October.

This year I have also decided that if a qualifier withdraws from the first round, then, I will substitute a reserve (ie, the ninth or tenth qualifier) directly into the withdrawing persons position whether

they are first, or eighth qualifier and the rest of the draw will remain unaltered. Hopefully, this will avoid the first-round byes we have been having.

The second issue is pace of play and how long rounds are taking. I understand there have been some issues recently! I have asked John Brettell and our Board Chair Richard Kingsbury (who is having some tendon surgery) to come out over the next few weeks marshalling members pace of play on the course. As a match committee we suggest that members and visitors playing our course should be aiming at playing each nine holes in about two hours and the pace of play is set and maintained by the lowest handicapper within the four. It is that person's responsibility to not allow a gap to be created between four in front (and if does – close the gap up – play ready golf, move the tee as soon as you've putted out, don't all wait to work out what order you need to tee off in, fill out score cards after you've teed off etc etc......)

Last Saturday, the 27th of August, was a Stroke competition off the Blue or Silver tees for men and the Yellow tees for women. 89 members played, and it is great that we are seeing these numbers on a regular basis, so we hope for very competitive fields in the Club Championships. It's great to see the Jackpot pool was finally starting to get a hit with Vance Heteraka and Allan McLelland picking it up \$100 each leaving the pool still at \$500. Jamie Howard picked up the Gross prize of \$17 with a score of 73 and the Birdie hole was #8, which was shared amongst a group of five.

The rounds of the day went to Kevin King in - Division Two (Blue) with a 70 from Daniel Bushby - Division One (Blue), Brian McOscar - Dividion Three (Silver) and Peter Bailey Division Four (Silver) all with 71's. Great scoring and its good to see Peter's golf on the improve! The full results are available on the website.

I have heard that the final of the Urlwin Rose Bowl went down to the last hole with James Willetts and Kyle Charlwood winning the last beating Kieran Foote and Tom Grimshaw.
